

First section is a reflection on youth, with the compass point as Jesus' own youth.


An interesting and brilliant chapter to give to a group of older students, to see what they take from it.





Chapter 2; Second section Focuses on Mary, who said "Yes" to God when she was very young, and on a whole range of young Saints.


These are wonderful models to discuss with young people, and this part of Chapter 2 is another great resource for your RE Team.













"Dear young people, make the most of these years of your youth ... don't confuse happiness with an armchair or live your life from behind a screen ... please, don't take early retirement"

"What can we elderly persons give to the young? We can remind today's young people, who have their own blend of heroic ambitions, that a life without love is an arid life. What can we tell them? But [for many young people there is] "an insurmountable disconnect between what they were taught and the way in which they live."

[Young people told the Synod] "The way they were instructed in religious and moral values did not prepare them to uphold those values in a world that holds them up to ridicule, nor did they learn ways of praying and practicing the faith that can be easily sustained amidst the fast pace of today's society."

Chapter 7

"Young people themselves are the agents of youth ministry."



Pope Francis and the synod urge us:
"Leave young people free to develop new approaches with creativity and a certain audacity."

"Help young people to use their insight, ingenuity and knowledge to address the issues and concerns of other young people in their own language."



Pope Francis and the Synod say:

"Education makes us raise questions, keeps us from being anaesthetised by banality, and impels us to pursue meaning in life."



"Rather than being concerned with trying to communicate a great deal of doctrine, let us first try to awaken and consolidate the great experiences that sustain the Christian life. In the words of Roman Guardini, 'when we experience a great love, everything else becomes part of it.'



"In some places it happens that young people are helped to have a powerful experience of God, an encounter with Jesus that touched their hearts, and the only follow up to this is a series of "formation" meetings featuring talks about doctrinal and moral issues ... as a result many young people get bored, they lose the fire of their encounter with Christ and the joy of following him."



"Youth ministry should always include occasions for renewing and deepening our personal experience of the love of God and the living Christ."



Imagine that the first half term of year 7 contained no formal RE classes at all, but instead young people were helped to discover the person of Jesus Christ.

They were offered different styles of prayer. They were helped to discover some of the Bible passages that most resonated for them, and to engage in acts of service that helped them to see what a living faith actually looks and feels like.

How different would that be to what you do now, at the start of Year 7?

Recognising young people who are orphans of the modern world, and who need a home.



"The qualities of such a mentor include:

Being a faithful Christian who engages with the Church and with the world.

Someone who constantly seeks holiness.

Someone who is a confidant without judgement.

Someone who actively listens to the needs of young people and responds in kind.


Someone deeply loving and self-aware.

Someone who recognises his or her limits and knows the joys and sorrows of the spiritual journey.



An especially important quality in mentors is the acknowledgement of their own humanity – the fact they are human beings who make mistakes, not perfect people but forgiven sinners. ... Mentors should not lead young people so they are simply passive followers, but walk alongside them, allowing them to be active participants in the journey. ...

They should believe wholeheartedly in the young person's ability to participate in the life of the Church ... and therefore nurture the seeds of faith in young people without expecting to see immediately the fruits of the work of the Holy Spirit."



To discover our vocation, says Pope Francis, is about "finding our true selves in the light of God and letting our lives flourish and bear fruit.

...Your vocation is inspires you to bring out the best in yourself for the glory of God and the good of others."




"I am asking you to rebel against this culture that sees everything as temporary and that ultimately believes you are incapable of responsibility, incapable of true love.

I have great confidence in you and for this reason I urge you to opt for marriage."




"Jesus is walking in our midst, as he did in Galilee. He walks through our streets and he quietly stops and looks into our eyes ... seek out that calm and quiet that enable you to reflect, pray, look more clearly at the world around you and then, with Jesus, come to recognise the vocation that is yours in this world."



Regarding discernment, the Pope says we are:

"immersed in a culture of zapping ... we navigate simultaneously on two or more screens ... without discernment we can easily become prey to every passing trend."





"Dear young people, my joyful hope is to see you keep running the race before you, outstripping all those who are slow or fearful.

Keep running, attracted by the face of Christ whom we love so much, whom we adore in the Holy Eucharist and acknowledge in the flesh of our suffering brothers and sisters.

May the Holy Spirit urge you on as you run this race.

The Church needs your momentum, your intuitions, your faith. We need them!
