Information on our keynote speakers

Nancy began her career as an early years teacher in Leeds at the end of the twentieth century. When she moved to Lancashire, she started working in the Catholic sector and taught across the primary age range as a class teacher, deputy and head. She completed her PhD in Religious Studies through Lancaster University in 2009 and has worked in secondary and university education. Nancy worked at part of the Diocese of Lancaster Education Service from 2012, taking over from Canon Luiz Ruscillo as DSC. She now works for the Catholic Education Service as an education adviser. Her research interests are RSE, virtue education and religious education.

Paul has had a lifelong interest and involvement in Catholic Religious Education, mainly at secondary level. As well as having a long teaching career, he has more recently worked in an advisory capacity for Northampton Diocese. He recently gained his doctorate in the philosophy of St John Henry Newman. He also has an academic interest in medieval philosophy and questions surrounding the epistemology of faith. He is currently an education adviser with Arundel and Brighton Catholic Diocese. He was part of a small core team who worked intensively to bring the Religious Education Curriculum Directory (particularly at Key Stage 3) towards its final form. He is also part of the writing team developing the Spirit and Life RE resources published by Hodder Education.
